



## Objecting to a removal

Any person may object to the removal of a company from the New Zealand Register of Companies (the Register) as long as it is no later than the date specified in the public notice.

### [How to object](#)

Once you have established that you have grounds to object, and are within the time limit for objections - submit your written objection to the Registrar.

### [What are the grounds for objecting?](#)

There are six grounds for objecting to the removal of a company set out in section 321 of the Companies Act 1993.

### [How we process your objection](#)

If evidence is supplied by the objector, the Registrar will suspend removal of the company for a reasonable time to allow for the objector to complete their dealings with the company.

### [Withdraw an existing objection](#)

How to withdraw an objection to the removal of a company you have lodged.

### [If the period for lodging objections has passed](#)

During the removal process there is an opportunity for creditors and other interested parties to object to the removal of a company.
