

For disqualified directors


A disqualified director is a person that has been banned (prohibited) from managing companies under either the Insolvency Act 1967 or the Companies Act 1993.

A search will confirm whether or not an individual has been banned, details of the Act under which the director was banned, and the duration of the prohibition.

- Searches of this database are FREE.

There are two options available to you for conducting a **Disqualified Director Search**

1. Quick search



Click on the **Search the register** tab in the top right hand corner of the screen.

Refine your search by clicking on **Options** and select the **Disqualified Directors** option.

To view instant results on screen just begin entering your search criteria into the 'Search' field. For a disqualified director search this might be the director's surname.

A list of possible matches will be displayed on screen and you can click on any one of these results to view the details of that company.

Click on the **SEARCH >>** button to display the complete search results for your search criteria.

2. Advanced Search

From the **Do It Now** menu choose **Advanced Search**.

Under 'Enter your search criteria' select the **Search for Directors and Shareholders** option. Then specify that you want to search for **Disqualified** directors.
